BYLAW AMENDMENTS

These amendments to The American Legion Post 38 Bylaws will be voted on at the April 2020 Post membership meeting and need a 2/3 vote of those present for them to become part of our Bylaws.

AMENDMENT ONE

ARTICLE 3 - ELECTED OFFICERS

3.1 The elected officers of the Post and length of term will be as follows:

Commander - 2 Year Term, First Vice Commander - 2 Year Term, Second Vice Commander - 2 Year Term, Third Vice Commander - 2 Year Term, Adjutant - 3 Year Term, Finance Officer - 3 Year Term, (Adjutant and Finance Officer elected on opposite years), Service Officer - 3 Year Term, Chaplain - 3 Year Term, Sergeant-at-Arms - 2 Year Term

3.2 Officers can be re-elected to a second term. (Commander, 1st Vice Commander, 2nd Vice Commander, and 3rd Vice Commanders are limited to (2) 2 year "elected" terms). Officers who are appointed to finish a term may then be elected and re-elected to serve two full terms. The Immediate Past Commander may serve an additional term only to fulfill the position of Immediate Past Commander.

3.3 After 12 consecutive years on the Executive Committee the member must wait at least 3 years before seeking another position.

3.4 Three Members-at-Large shall also be elected to serve on the Executive Committee (1 elected per year), with terms expiring alternating years. They will be elected to serve a three-year term with one Member-at-Large being elected each year. Members-at-Large may not run for re-election after serving one full elected term.

3.5 Will be deleted

ARTICLE 7 - ELECTIONS

7.3 No member shall hold the office of Commander for more than two (2) consecutive elected terms. Vice-Commanders may not stay in the same Vice-Commander position for more than two (2) consecutive elected terms No member shall hold more than one Post elected position. The Immediate Past Commander may serve an additional term only to fulfill the position of Immediate Past Commander.

AMENDMENT TWO

ARTICLE 5 - POST EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETINGS

5.4 The Executive Committee will review all Post expenditures. Any expenditure of more than \$100.00 which is not provided for in the Post budget, will be referred to the Finance Committee for further study and recommendation or the Finance Officer, if time is an issue, for a recommendation. The Finance Committee or Finance Officer will make its recommendations to the Executive Committee for further action on request for expenditures. All expenditures will be voted upon separately at regular Post Membership meetings unless they have been previously contained within the Post budget. Restricted Funds will be exempt from this process. In the event of an emergency that requires immediate attention, this Bylaw can be suspended by a 2/3 vote of the Executive Committee members present. The Post Membership should confirm the action taken by the Executive Committee at the next regular Post Membership meeting.

The Nominations Committee is still looking for Post 38 members who would like to serve in the following positions:

First Vice-Commander: The First Vice-Commander will assume the duties of the Commander, at a moment's notice, in the Commander's absence or disability or when called upon to do so by the Commander. The First Vice-Commander will be the Chairperson of the Membership Committee. The First Vice-Commander will attend all House Committee meetings as a non-voting member. The First Vice-Commander will perform such duties as may be required by the Commander.

Third Vice-Commander: The Third Vice-Commander shall serve as the chairperson of the Events Committee. The Third Vice-Commander will perform such duties as may be required by the Commander.

Adjutant: The Adjutant shall have charge of the keeping of a full and correct record of all proceedings of the Post Membership and the Executive Committee meetings and keep such records as the Department of Wisconsin and the National Organization may require. There shall be close cooperation between the Post Adjutant and the Historian. Under the direction of the Commander, the Adjutant shall handle all correspondence of the Post. The Adjutant, Finance Officer and the Commander shall, when directed by the Executive Committee and ratified by the Post Membership, execute for and on behalf of the Post all deeds, bonds and contracts, the execution of which may be necessary to the proper management of the business of the Post. The Adjutant shall provide each member of the Executive Committee with a copy of these Bylaws within thirty (30) days of their election. The Adjutant will have a line item budgeted for supplies needed to conduct the business of the office of the Adjutant. The Finance Committee shall evaluate the necessary amount and include it in the budget.

Post Chaplain: The Post Chaplain shall be charged with the spiritual welfare of the Post and will offer divine but non-sectarian service in the event of dedications, funerals, public functions, etc., and adhere to such ceremonial rituals as are recommended by the National or Department Headquarters from time to time. The Post Chaplain is charged with visiting and comforting members and their families when sick or bereaved, with visiting ex-service personnel in hospitals and in notifying the Post Membership concerning members who are deceased, in care facilities, ill or recovering from illness or surgery. The Chaplain should be assisted by the membership in securing this information and in visiting of the sick and bereaved. The Chaplain shall chair the Visiting & Volunteer Committee.

2020 -2021
Article 7 – Elections

Article 7.8 (a) Election:

The voting for officers and members at large of the Executive Committee shall take place at the May Post Meeting one hour prior to the meeting. At the conclusion of the time allotted for voting the Ballot Committee shall take into its custody all ballots cast and tally the results.

Article 7.8 (b) Voting by mail:

A copy of the ballot shall be published in the Post Reporter and on the Post web site and will be distributed to all members in good standing by April 15 with instructions for balloting by mail. All Post members who desire to vote by mail shall return the ballot sent to them, either by mail or personal delivery to the ballot box at:

The ballot shall be contained in a sealed envelope with the voter's name written legibly on the outside of the envelope. All ballots received by mail or personally delivered shall remain in the ballot box sealed and be turned over to the ballot committee at the beginning of the voting process. Ballots are to remain sealed until the close of the voting process. The ballot committee shall destroy any ballots received by mail or personally delivered from a member who attends the meeting to vote in person.

Article 7.8 (c) Voting in Person:

All members of the Post in good standing who attend the May Post meeting shall be entitled to vote in person on a ballot provided to them by the Ballot Committee at the meeting.
