Membership renewals are generated at the National level, not at Post level. These renewals are addressed to your Post of record, which will be Post 38. When you get these renewal notices (you will begin to receive these in early July), you can renew online through the mylegion.org site or you can submit your renewal form in the envelope provided. I would discourage just dropping into Club 38 to renew. If you attend a Post meeting and wish to renew, that can be done at that time. We will have the membership cards at all Post 38 meetings. Please be certain to have your renewal notice or membership card with you. AGAIN, I would discourage dropping off your membership payment for renewal at Club 38. The Club and Post are separate entities. If you renew online, you can print out your membership card at that time as well.

As to your membership renewal and renewal notices....

Membership in The American Legion is based on a calendar-year from January 1st to December 31st. When a member pays their dues, they are paid up for that upcoming membership year. They will also receive twelve monthly subscriptions to The American Legion Magazine.

The renewal process begins in July for the upcoming membership year. Renewal notices are sent out in July, October, January, March and May. When a member renews, they are removed from future renewal notices for that year. There are times when a member pays their dues, but they still receive a renewal notice. If dues are paid to the local post, it takes a little longer for national to be notified about the renewal and the member may receive another renewal notice. If this occurs, please check with your local post to ensure they have received your dues.

When you send in your renewal, there is a process and also a lag time from when we, at the Post level, receive your payment and get this processed to when National receives the data and processes your renewal. We tend to see many resubmissions of payments, and this requires more research and to confirm you have already paid. PLEASE make note of when you submitted your payment as most likely you will receive another renewal notice from National in the meantime. Please do not duplicate your payments.

If you have an active email address, we would appreciate if you made note of this as we are trying to save costs and email you the newsletter and meeting minutes. Also please note any changes to your contact information, especially your address. If you are a PUFL, National and Department will list you as inactive if they receive undeliverable mail sent to you. This is NOT the Post doing this!

Unit 38 History the 1950's

The Unit had organized a chorus under the direction of Mrs. Warner. We donated milk to families who couldn't afford the money. We donated 52 quarts of milk to one family for a cost of \$9.10. In 1951 173 quarts of milk were donated to 3 families. We even donated coal to a family who were eligible thru the "Soldiers/Sailors Relief Fund". The SAL Drum Corp was also organized, and they played at various events. The Post and Auxiliary held joint officers' installations.

In 1953 Anita Kapp was installed as Unit President. We had our Poppy Headquarters at Conway Hotel, downtown for many years. The Past President's Parley organization donated \$1000 towards two new hospital rooms at Memorial Hospital being built in Appleton-this probably is Theda Care or AMC.

Can you believe the cost to send one girl to Badger Girls State was \$30 while boys were \$35? In 2022 the cost is \$350 for a girl and \$400 for a boy.

The new clubhouse was dedicated in October 1955. The Unit paid for the new drapes and were given access to the kitchen by the Legion Post. The Auxiliary loaned the Post \$3000 to complete the cost of the building of the clubhouse-which was later cancelled in 1959 as a Birthday present to the Legion. Because of the threat of Polio all junior meetings were cancelled.

Sometime in 1956 the auxiliary changed their Constitution/bylaws to coincide with National to include the eligibility for stepmothers, step-daughters, and stepsister to join. The Auxiliary arranged to have yearly Mother-Daughter banquets around Mother's Day and the Gold Star mothers were our guests.

While there was so much information to read, I just touched on a few highlights. Hope you enjoyed this small-time capsule.
