## POST MEMBERSHIP MESSAGE

From the Adjutant and Membership Committee

The new membership year is upon us. To renew online go to <https://mylegion.org>. As we did last year we will be doing bulk mailing for the first batch of 200 renewals, so if you don't get your card right away that is why. Also, **with the new budget we approved covering the renewal cost for members with over 50 years continuous service and 5 years of continuous membership at Post 38. If you fall under that category, please do not send in your renewal if you get a notice.** If you have renewed already, you are paid in the system so you shouldn't get another notice. The new website is a little slow to process the

memberships, **so if you get a renewal in the mail please check to make sure you haven't already paid before sending in another check.** You can call or email the commander if you aren't sure.

### **Membership renewals and the renewal processes**

Membership renewals are generated at the National level, not at Post level. These renewals are addressed to your Post of record, which will be Post 38. When you get these renewal notices (you will begin to receive these in early July), you can renew online through the mylegion.org site or you can submit your renewal form in the envelope provided. I would discourage just dropping into Club 38 to renew. If you attend a Post meeting and wish to renew, that can be done at that time. We will have the membership cards at all Post 38 meetings. Please be certain to have your renewal notice or membership card with you. AGAIN, I would discourage dropping off your membership payment for renewal at Club 38. The Club and Post are separate entities. If you renew online, you can print out your membership card at that time as well.

### **As to your membership renewal and renewal notices....**

Membership in The American Legion is based on a calendar-year from January 1st to December 31st. When a member pays their dues, they are paid up for that upcoming membership year. They will also receive twelve monthly subscriptions to The American Legion Magazine.

**The renewal process begins in July for the upcoming membership year.** Renewal notices are sent out in July, October, January, March and May. When a member renews, they are removed from future renewal notices for that year. There are times when a member pays their dues, but they still receive a renewal notice. If dues are paid to the local post, it takes a little longer for national to be notified about the renewal and the member may receive another renewal notice. If this occurs, please check with your local post to ensure they have received your dues.

When you send in your renewal, there is a process and also a lag time from when we, at the Post level, receive your payment and get this processed to when National receives the data and processes your renewal. We tend to see many resubmissions of payments, and this requires more research and to confirm you have already paid. PLEASE make note of when you submitted your payment as most likely you will receive another renewal notice from National in the meantime. Please do not duplicate your payments.

If you have an active email address, we would appreciate if you made note of this as we are trying to save costs and email you the newsletter and meeting minutes. Also please note any changes to your contact information, especially your address. If you are a PUFL, National and Department will list you as inactive if they receive undeliverable mail sent to you. This is NOT the Post doing this!

**BLUE STAR BANNER FOR THOSE DEPLOYED IN THE ARMED FORCES:**

The Auxiliary has purchased Blue Star Banners for distribution through our Poppy Fund. The Blue Star Service Banner was designed and patented in 1917 by World War I Army Capt. Robert L. Queissner of the 5th Ohio Infantry who had two sons serving on the front line. It quickly became the unofficial symbol of a child in the service.

These Blue Star Banners are displayed by families who have a loved one serving in the armed forces including the National Guard and Reserves of all military departments. The banner is usually displayed in the front window of a home to show the family's pride in their loved one serving in the military and reminds others that preserving America's freedom demands much.

## Chaplain's Corner

Ever wonder how or what a simple, small item or act can express? Let us consider stones, pebbles, and coins in a cemetery. Each is small, not heavy, and easily carried.

When visiting a cemetery, have you wondered why there were pebbles or stones placed on a headstone? Who placed them and what in the world does it mean? History shares stones were piled on top of each other to create a marker where someone was buried. Today, the presence of a stone or pebble shares with mourners that someone else, also, is grieving the passing of the deceased. Stones and pebbles are a permanent reminder at the site; flowers, once beautiful, fade and wither away.



Have you seen coins on headstones when visiting a soldier's final place of rest? No, the coin(s) are not paying an I.O.U. A penny has been placed on the headstone to let the soldier's family know someone came by and paid their respects. The nickel is from someone who trained at boot camp with the deceased veteran. Having served with the veteran in some capacity is represented with a dime. The quarter signifies the person was there when the veteran died. Once a month the coins are collected and used for cemetery maintenance, the cost to bury a soldier, or care for soldiers in need.

We have gift cards available for purchase. You can help Club 38 by purchasing gift cards for gifts or for yourself.

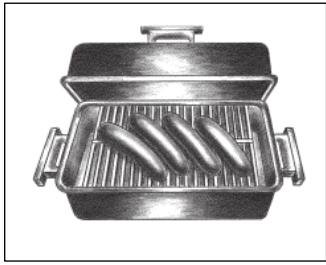
Another way you can help us is as a volunteer in the kitchen on Friday nights. To get the Club back up to full service we need more employees and/or volunteers.
